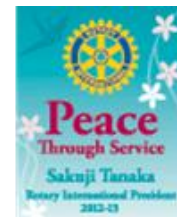

Rick Carnagua, District Governor, asks, “What is your Rotary Moment?”



As President Don Stanger introduced our District Governor and listed his many accomplishments, the tone of Governor Carnagua’s speech was already set. Originally from Indiana and a graduate of Ball State with a degree in Finance, Carnagua has already had many careers, ranging from the pharmaceuticals industry to flooring. But it is his record of service, beyond Rotary, that truly impresses. He has clearly served his home of Cary well both on

Boards at Parks and Recreation as well as Leadership Raleigh. As a Rotarian he has served as President, been named a Paul Harris Fellow numerous times and named Rotarian of the year twice. Just knowing what our own Vandana Dake does annually brought this into sharp focus: Rick Carnagua has been a devoted Rotarian for 23 years.

Carnagua began by stating he was not “a podium guy” so he walked into our group as he spoke. And explaining that he hasn’t worn a watch for over 12 years, he asked our Newman Aguiar (and his Assistant District Governor) to watch his time for him. He reminded the club that our district is large, encompassing 45 clubs and, as of today with the induction of Ernie Mills, Jr., we have 1,825 members.

But he asked, right away, if we all had a Rotary Moment. A Rotary Story? That moment when you are doing some sort of Rotary activity and you stand back for a moment and say, “I get it”. I have heard this same refrain from Newman who was President when I became a Rotarian, and I was grateful for the reminder, because as Carnagua reminds us, citing stats and talking to new members is all well and good, but it’s much better if you have a Rotary Story to share, and he is blessed with many. He explains that our path of Rotary is the path of service and fellowship. He cited getting to know members as you ring the Salvation Army bell together during the holidays, and that for over a decade he has made meals at the Ronald McDonald houses in Chapel Hill and Durham. Sitting down with the families afterward and hearing their stories he had also given him many such moments.

Like President Stanger, Carnagua has a passion about home ownership and so his club has built three Habitat for Humanity homes in Cary, but in 2005, 15 of his club members went to the Dominican Republic to build homes for an entire week, and this, too, was full of Rotary Moments.

He included Rotary’s efforts to eradicate polio worldwide as something we can all be proud of as well.

He then turned to our new Rotary International President’s theme of Peace through Service, because those in need that we serve have no peace in their lives. In our own district, we need 45,000 books for children K-fifth grade. This is not hard to accomplish together; it amounts to a mere 25 books per Rotarian, many of which can be obtained for cents at thrift stores or even found at home. He then presented President Don with our club’s first five books as a gift.
