The Latino Community Credit Union



One of my more disturbing dreams is being lost in a town where I know I have a place to go but can't find it, nobody can understand what I'm saying, and my wallet seems to have disappeared. If the dream is really bad, I'm underdressed --- or worse.

Rotarian Jenny Levine introduced a program about the Latino Community Credit Union's mission to integrate immigrants into the financial mainstream. Our two presenters were Gabe Treves, a Development and Community Affairs Senior Specialist, and Silvia Rincon, Director, Office of the CEO.

In the kindergarten class that Don Stanger and I tutored in this year, there were several Latino students who spoke virtually no English. The challenge with one young guy was to get him to even say his name and acknowledge your presence. Happily, by the end of the year, his natural gregariousness had fully emerged and the challenge was to get him to sit still for a few moments. He may not have won any reading awards, but at least he wasn't so overwhelmed by the bad dream that he was waking from. This ignited the flares of empathy and appreciation for the courage it takes to face the difficulties of settling in a strange country, often with few resources.

Mr. Treves, who gave the bulk of the presentation, described another hurdle beyond school and language that immigrants must deal with when they come to this country --- that is, integrating into the financial mainstream.
