PAST-PRESIDENT NEWMAN AGUIAR AMPS UP CALL FOR LOCAL, GLOBAL SERVICE



In politics, they call it red meat. In business, a set piece speech. In certain places of worship, think sermon. At lunch on Monday, let's call it an energized, inspiring and clear call for community and global service by Past-President, Newman Aguiar.

In his new role as Governor of District 7710, which includes 46 Clubs across the RTP region, Aguiar is in demand and has made his way through about half of the organizations so far. That's certainly good news for the broader Rotary organization.

Back in Downtown Durham, however, we don't get to see as much of him as we used to. But we're adjusting, if only for the greater good.

"It's great to be back home," Aguiar said by way of opening after a brief introduction by President Lois. "I feel like I have missed more meetings at this Club than I have in my entire Rotary life. It's great to be back."

Speaking with a few notes, and the passion and practice of a man who knows his message, Aguiar reminded Members of just a few of their biggest collective accomplishments in the past Rotary year under Past-President, Vandana Dake. We recruited 41 new members, for example, and gave away more than \$62,000 collectively to the Foundation. Our upcoming "Fill That Bus" Campaign to help collect needed supplies and equipment for area students has set a goal of \$120,000 in donated value this year, up from \$100,000 accomplished last year.

"We have a great capacity for doing good in this Club," he said, noting the large number of "100 Acts of Service Above Self" that have occurred during the Club's Centennial Celebration.

Globally, he noted Nigeria has now experienced a full calendar year without a single reported Polio case, thanks, in part, to work and donations by RI. "We have a Polio-free Africa," he said. "That is the power of Rotary."

He stressed this year's theme, urging all Members to become "A Gift To The World."

Aguiar lightened things up with displays of various organizational badges, campaign ribbons, and assorted "bling" pinned on sashes reminiscent of scouting merit badges. He said he has proposed a new badge for clubs that meet specific recruitment, contributions, and other critical operating metrics by which the Rotary Organization gauges its own efficiency, including attending at meetings, functions, and service projects.

"Be there," he said. "Be present. Because we benefit most as Rotarians when we are present."
