LATE-SUMMER UPDATES

ON CENTERFEST 2015, MUSEUM OF LIFE AND SCIENCE EXPANSIONS



Sherry DeVries highlighted Rotary’s financial and volunteer support this year for Centerfest 2015, the major downtown art-lovers event now rated among the nation’s Top 100 Arts Festivals in the United States.

“Out of thousands of art festivals around the country, we are delighted to achieve this,” she said at Monday lunch, thanking our Club for its “Palladium” sponsorship of the popular destination festival in September. Each fall, the regional confab enlivens City Center, including Morris, Main, and Chapel Hill Streets, Five Points, and the CCB Plaza.

Financial and volunteer support for CenterFest this year makes the project the biggest Club event across its entire Centennial Year, said Brady Surles, who introduced DeVries. Rotary is promoting the work of Rotary International and all Durham-area Rotary Clubs during the Festival.

Each fall, for the past 41 years, juried fine artists, craftsmen, and performers from across the country gather together in Durham as part of North Carolina’s longest-running outdoors arts festival. This year, DeVries said, 140 juried visual artists representing 16 states were expected to showcase original hand-crafted work in basket weaving, clay, drawing, fibers, glass, painting, photography, wood, jewelry, and other forms.

Also presenting an update about a subject near and dear to all was Julie Rigby with news about big things ready to launch at The North Carolina Museum of Life and Science. Hideaway Woods officially debuts at the end of the month, marking completion of a \$4 Million Dollar treescape and playscape project.

Rigby highlighted a lot of great publicity stemming from the expansion sure to delight patrons of all ages.

The forested learning environment will feature trails, treehouses, rope bridges, and abundant examples of nature’s beauty intended to teach. “It’s a nature-based exhibit,” Rigby said. “It will change every day. It will change with the seasons.”
